Turnover as at 31 December 2004 Organic growth confirmed for 2004

The CS Group's consolidated turnover for financial year 2004 stands at 348 M€, up 1% on a comparable structure and exchange rate basis compared with the previous year. Turnover for the 4th quarter of 2004 stands at 96 M€, up 3% on a comparable structure and exchange rate basis compared with the 4th quarter of 2003. As announced, CS has returned to organic growth over the second quarter of 2004 (+6%).

In 2004, CS has bolstered its position as designer, integrator and operator of mission critical systems, by winning the design and construction supervision on major projects such as information and command centres for the police force and video surveillance for the city of Lyon that are indicative of CS's increasing influence in the area of Homeland Security – outsourcing of mission critical systems for Eramet and Eurocontrol; intelligent transportation systems for roads (free flow technologies) in Chile and the USA; collaborative infrastructures for the Ministry of Agriculture and ADAE (Electronic Administration Development Agency) – and demonstrate the role played by CS in the upswing of e-administration.

This growth in turnover was also accompanied by a hike in the order book, thus confirming CS's development dynamics.

The results for financial year 2004 will be presented on 7 March.
